### The Malta China Friendship Society is 34 Years Old

When in January 1972 Malta recognized Red China and established diplomatic relations with the People's Republic of China, the news sent shockwaves throughout Europe. In Malta the move was staunchly opposed by certain forces. A misinformation campaign was orchestrated to depict China as a dangerous Country whose only interest was to 'swallow' Malta to use it as a platform to influence the Middle East and Europe. Off course some of these fears were genuine. Most of the campaign was however politically motivated. It was under this scenario that in 1973 I decided to set up the Malta China Friendship Society.

For 34 years the Malta China Friendship Society has probably done more than the Governments of the two countries to bring the two people together. In the seventies and eighties we brought to Malta acrobatic troupes from China. Artists, organized exhibitions of Chinese paintings and arts and shown a large number of films about China. Throughout these 34 years the Maltese people have learned to respect the Chinese people for their hardworking attitude, their respect for the law and above all for their correct way in which they behaved in Malta.

We have sent to China Maltese artists that exhibited their work there and exchanged visits between members of the M.C.F.S. and a large number of delegations from Friendship Associations from at lesst 2O different provinces from China.

Last it was an exceptional year for the M.C.F.S. We managed to organize a group of children dancers from the Msida Dance Centre to take part in the Tianjin Festival. Wee took part in the 50th anniversary celebrations in Guangdong and even organized a Chinese Food Festival and a stamp exhibition in this large province of China. We also took part in the 50th anniversary celebrations of the Shanghai Friendship Associates.

When China opened up the Chinese Cultural Centre some years ago, a centre which is funded and very well organized, many thought that the M.C.F.S. would now die a natural death. However we are still marching on. We have found new areas where we manage to bring the people of China and Malta together.

This is our mission. Hopefully in the years to come the M.C.F.S. will still strive to fulfill it.

# **Chinese New Year Dinner**



The Malta China Friendship Society commemorated the new Chinese year by organizing a Chinese Dinner at the Il-Fanal Chinese Restaurant Marsaskala.
